

XML: A Functional Primer (Live Online)

This class introduces the basics of markup languages, from SGML through XML. It then introduces the fundamentals of XML, DTD creation and Extensible Styling Language (XSL).

XML, the Extensible Markup Language, has become the Lingua Franca of the new age of data exchange languages. From everything from RSS to SOAP, XHTML to Atom, and from TEI to EAD, XML permeates our data. XML is one of the most flexible tools out there

for encapsulating all kinds of data in a plain text format, suitable not only for long term storage, but for any application imaginable.

This 2-hour live online course taught on consecutive days introduces the fundamentals of modern markup languages, covering the nuts and bolts of writing your first document. It touches on data validation, editors and data modeling. The course also introduces the fundamentals of creating your own Document Type Definitions (DTDs), and style sheets using XSL.
